Distinguish Speaker's Lecture June 2004

The spring 2004, distinguish speaker lecture was held on June 30th, 2004 at the Imperial Chinese Restaurant. It was very well attended with over 20 members and spouses. The speaker was Dr Gabor Mate. He is a family doctor and author who have contributed to columns in newspaper including The Vancouver Sun and the national Globe and Mail.

His book titled "When The Body Says No" is a national bestseller. His most recent book called "Scattered Minds" is also a bestseller. The theme of the lecture was about how our emotional health will affect our whole body, including our immune system and its relationship to many diseases like cancer and multiple sclerosis. He outlined that the suppression of anger, which most of us were taught to do, would turn inward against our own body. He recommended letting out our emotions as a way of improving our health. He also explained how the stress inside could lead to cancer, as he pointed out what a "Cancer Personality" was about. Lastly, he described his "Seven A's" of managing our mental health. It is a very informative sessions to doctors and lay people alike. The lecture was very useful to the caregivers that have to handle sick patient everyday. It was also useful to ordinary people like us who are being bombarded by stressful events. It taught us how to stay healthy, both mentally and physically. Many of the attendants were impressed by his talk and bought his book that night. It turned out to be a very successful event and enjoyed by all participants. Several books were offered as door prizes as well to those lucky few.

2005 Summer Baltic Cruise CME


Do you want to bring your family to a cruise and visits 7 beautiful cities in the Baltic Sea region?
